Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us

Saint Teresa of Avila was born on March 28, 1515. She always thought of herself as a horrible sinner. When she was 16, her father was very strict and thought she was out of control and rebellious, He sent her to a convent and she hated it at first. Her love for God began to grow and she liked that the convent was less strict than her father. She had a hard time when she needed to choose between marrying or religious life. She decided that the Carmelites were the best choice since she felt it was a better place for someone like her who was prone to sin. She eventually found that God should be first in her life. It was difficult but she founded a new convent, St. Joseph's, that was dedicated to a simple life of poverty and dedicated to prayer. At St. Joseph's, she spent most of her time writing her life story. St. Teresa is the patron saint of headache sufferers. She was canonized in 1622 and she is the first woman to be proclaimed a doctor in the Church.
