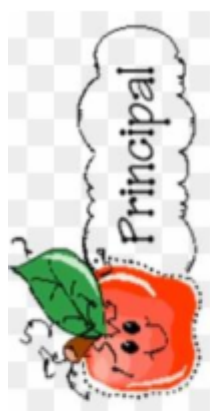

### Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us

*Saints Simon and Jude*, apostles, were both sent to preach the Gospel in Mesopotamia and Persia. We do not know a lot about them except what is told in the New Testament. Saint Simon is usually shown with a saw depicting his martyrdom and he is the patron saint of curriers, sawmen, and tanners. Saint Jude was a cousin of Jesus by being a nephew of St Joseph. In St. John's Gospel, nearing the end of the Last Supper, our Lord said: "He that loveth Me, shall be loved of My Father; and I will love him and will manifest Myself to him." Then Jude asked Him: "Lord, how is it, that Thou wilt manifest Thyself to us, and not to the world?" And he received from Jesus this reply: "If any one loves Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him, and will make Our abode with him. He that loveth Me not keepeth not My word. And the word which you have heard is not Mine, but the Father's who sent Me." Saint Jude is the patron saint of desperate causes, hospitals and hospital workers.
