- **No sleeveless shirts or tank tops**
- **No cropped tops**
- **T-shirts with alcohol, political or tobacco logos, or offensive or inappropriate language/designs will not be acceptable**
- **Other tops, sweatshirts, or hoodies are acceptable**
- **Bottoms - Jeans, pants, capris, dresses, skorts, leggings with long top, athletic, or sweatpants are acceptable.**
- **- Bottoms may not be shorter than 3 inches above the top of the knee.**

Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us

St. Bruno was born in Cologne and about 1055 he was ordained and became a canon at St. Cunibert's. He eventually became a hermit and was one of the men who started the Carthusian order. They embraced a life of poverty, manual work, prayer, and transcribing transcripts. He wrote several commentaries on the psalms and St. Paul's epistles. He was never formally canonized because of the Carthusians' aversion to public honors but Pope Leo X granted them permission to celebrate his feast day, October 6, in 1514.
