

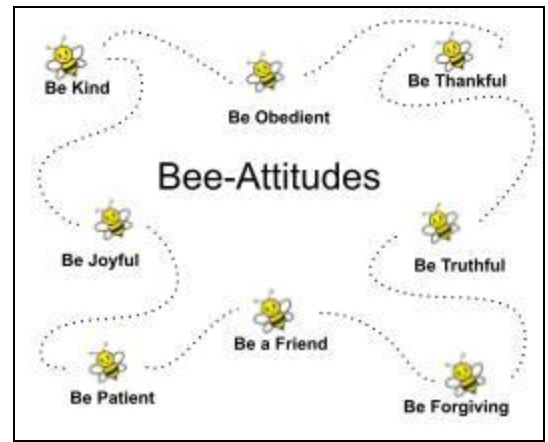

### Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us

Saint Cyprian became a Christian as an adult. He took the vow of chastity before he was baptized. He helped the poor by distributing items. Within two years he was ordained a priest and was named the bishop of Carthage against his will. He complained about people not having the "true spirit of faith" and when the Decian persecution started, many Christians left the Church. It was their reinstatement that caused much controversy in the third century. This helped the Church progress in its understanding of the sacrament of Penance. During a plague in Carthage, he encouraged people to help all people including their enemies. He was cheerful but serious. He was martyred and his feast day is September 16. He is the patron saint of North Africa and was often called the African Pope.
