Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us:

Saint Raphael the Archangel is one of the seven Archangels and one of three who are mentioned in the Bible by name. His name means "God heals" and this identity came from the biblical story that he healed the Earth after being defiled by the sins of the fallen angels. In the book of Tobit, Raphael disguised himself as a man and traveled beside Tobiah, Tobit's son. When they return, Raphael explains to Tobit that he was sent by God to heal his blindness and deliver his future wife, Sarah, from a demon. It was then said that his healing powers were revealed and makes him known as "one of the seven who stand before the Lord." *Tobit 12:15* St. Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, the blind, bodily ill, happy meetings, nurses, physicians and medical workers. He is often pictured holding or standing on a fish. His feast day is celebrated on September 29, along with St. Michael and St. Gabriel. Saint Raphael, pray for us.
