Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us:
Saint Elizabeth of Hungary was born on July 7 in 1207. She had responsibilities of being royal required upon her from a young age. At a very young age, it had been arranged for her to be married to Ludwig IV of Thuringia, a German nobleman. She was sent away at the age of four for education in Thuringia. Her mother was murdered when she was just six and this changed her thoughts on life and death and she started to have a more prayerful life, searching for peace. She and Ludwig, whom she loved, married in 1221 and they eventually had three children. Her life was filled with prayer and service to the poor and she used her royal position to increase her mission for charity. She learned about Francis of Assisi and began to model her life after his. Ludwig died in 1227 and she vowed to never marry again. She joined the Third Order of St. Francis and founded a hospital in his name. One of her greatest miracles was the Miracle of Roses. While she was bringing bread to the poor in secret, she had the bread hidden under her cloak. Visions of white and red roses appeared when she was questioned if she was stealing treasures from the castle. Her feast day is November 17 and she is the patron saint of bakers, beggars, brides, charities, death of children, homeless people, hospitals, widows and Sisters of Mercy.
