Our Friends in Heaven, Pray for Us:

Saint Leo the Great was born into a Roman aristocratic family in the year 400. He was a well-known deacon by 431 for his love for the Lord, his intelligence and persuasiveness. He had a gift for helping reconcile disputes between people in both secular and theological situations. Leo was unanimously elected Pope to succeed Pope Sixtus III in 440. He was dedicated to his service as Pope and became known as the best administrative pope of the ancient Church. During his time, he fought for the unity of the Church and its faith. He resolved the doctrinal controversy on Church's teaching of Jesus' humanity and divinity with a letter stating that Jesus Christ was One Person with a human and a divine nature which could not be separated. Pope Leo was known for his profound spiritual sermons. He was proclaimed as a Doctor of the Church in 1754 and is the patron saint of Popes and confessors. His feast day is November 10.

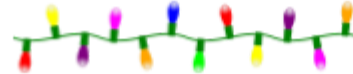
