Saint John of God was only eight years old when he ran away from home and never to see his parents again. He wanted to be with some visiting priests who spoke of the adventures that were waiting when the new world opened up. They would beg their way from village to village. He became sick and a man took him in and nursed him back to health. This man eventually adopted him and wanted John to marry his daughter. John took off to join the Spanish army and was far from being a holy man. At a point he was frightened that he was going to be captured by the French and he vowed to change his life. He listened to a sermon by John of Avila about repentance and he was overcome by the thought of his own sins and he gave his possessions away. The townspeople thought he went mad. Friends brought him to the hospital where he was treated like a lunatic and was tied down and whipped daily. After 40 days, John of Avila came and said his suffering was long enough - just like the Lord. John could not see any suffering without helping and people criticized him for his love that embraced anyone in need. He died on his 55th birthday and his feast day is March 8. He is the patron saint of booksellers, printers, heart patients, hospitals, nurses, the sick and firefighters.
